



Krakow another winner in the U15 category

Two U15 tournaments took place this weekend and one of them was played in Trnava, Slovakia. The boys of the Polish team Korona 1919 Krakow experienced a successful debut in the competition, who took home the victory.

For the first time in a téro season across all categories, it happened that the winner did not win all the matches in the tournament. In Trnava, more than one team strove for first place, and in the end, two Polish teams were the closest to it. In the end, the winning team Korona 1919 Krakow had the same 4-1 record as their compatriots from another newcomer to the competition WKS Slask Wroclaw . Krakow's first place was decided by a 58:53 win from a mutual match.

The bronze goes to the Czech Republic and is won by BK VIVIDBOOKS Pardubice for a 3-2 record. They only lost to both Polish opponents and dominated the rest of the matches quite clearly.

The evenness of the tournament is also proven by the ranking on the 4th and 5th place, where Sršni Písek and ŠBK Handlová had the same balance of 2-3. However, their mutual duel sounded clear for Písek.

In the end, the last place without a single win was left to the home team Slávia Trnava.
